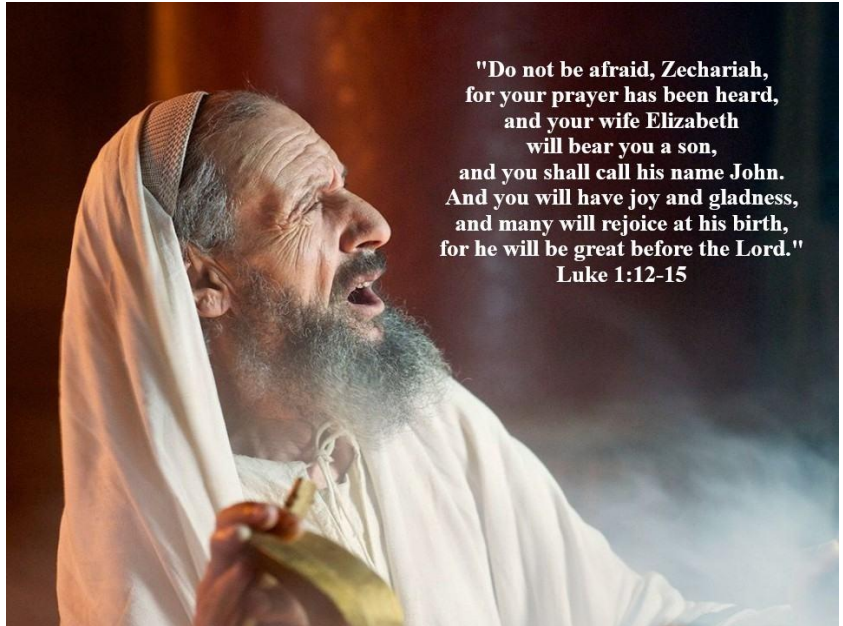

The Lord Jesus Comes in Humility to Redeem Us

The season of Advent begins with the appearance of the angel Gabriel telling Zechariah the priest "...your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John" (Luke 1:13) Zechariah responds, "Whereby shall I know this?" (Luke 1:18) It is hard to fault Zechariah for his question. The news was almost too much to believe. However, the angel did not appreciate the lack of trust on the part of Zechariah. Disbelief has no place in the house of God or the heart of man. Zechariah stands for all time as the man who put the first question mark on Christmas. Gabriel tells Zechariah he would be "silent and unable to speak until the day that these things take place." (Luke 1:18) In the quietness of his heart Zechariah would have plenty of time to ponder the words of God's promise. Gabriel's words "which shall be fulfilled in their season" is a powerful reminder that disbelief does not stop the promises of God from being fulfilled. Faithless people could not prevent the first Christmas, and they cannot prevent Christ's coming today.

Welcome to our Guests and Visitors! The congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is pleased and honored to have you worship with us today. Today is the First Sunday of Advent... a season of repentance, waiting and watching, looks forward in hope. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in the flesh in history to accomplish our salvation, will also return in the same way to be our judge on the last day and bring us into eternal life.

God's Word teaches the real presence of Christ's body and blood... invisibly in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins. We take seriously the spiritual care of those who commune at our altar. The Word of God states that no one offend against Christ and His Word by denying His true presence and its promise and seal of forgiveness. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (see 1 Cor. 11:27-29). Because Holy Communion is a confession of what is taught and believed at this altar (1 Cor. 11:26), any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession (beliefs) differing from that of this congregation (that is, belong to another church body or denomination) and yet desire to receive the sacrament, will want to first speak with the pastor before communing.

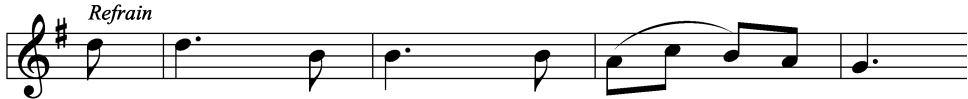
