***The Cross and Passion of Our Lord
Are the Hour of His Glory***

The King of Israel comes into His royal glory by the path of humble obedience “to the point of death, even death on a cross” (Phil. 2:8). He “goes as it has been determined” (Luke 22:22), according to the Scriptures, willingly submitting to His Father’s plan for the salvation of sinners. “Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name” (Phil. 2:9). His suffering and death open the way of repentance for the forgiveness of sins because He goes to the cross bearing the sins of the world. In His resurrection, God the Father vindicates His people and has compassion on His servants (Deut. 32:36). He kills to make alive; He wounds in order to heal. In remembrance of Him, we praise God, confessing “that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father” (Phil. 2:11).

Welcome to our Guests and Visitors! The congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is pleased and honored to have you worship with us today. God’s Word teaches the real presence of Christ’s body and blood... invisibly in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins. We take seriously the spiritual care of those who commune at our altar. The Word of God states that no one offend against Christ and His Word by denying His true presence and its promise and seal of forgiveness. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (see 1 Cor. 11:27-29). Because Holy Communion is a confession of what is taught and believed at this altar (1 Cor. 11:26), any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession (beliefs) differing from that of this congregation (that is, belong to another church body or denomination) and yet desire to receive the sacrament, will want to first speak with the pastor before communing.

Northwestern Food Pantry... thanks the congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church for our donations of goods and money. In March, we helped provide food for 213 families, representing 531 individuals. These 213 families break down to 139 seniors, 249 adults, and 143 children. The Food Pantry added 6 new families with 14 new individuals. They are currently distributing over 18,000 pounds of food and produce monthly, 426 dozen fresh eggs, and personal health items to supplement the family's nutritional and personal health needs. They were blessed to have 20 volunteers on Saturday and 14 on Monday for the monthly distributions. Northwestern Food Pantry serves the boroughs of Albion, Cranesville and Plateau and the townships of Conneaut, Elk Creek and Springfield, a total of 122 square miles. They are open on the third Saturday of every month from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM and also the Monday following the third Saturday from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. Northwestern Food Pantry relies on volunteers and donations from people with big hearts that don't want anyone in need to go hungry. Please consider donating or volunteering to make our community hunger-free.
